## THE SPIRITUAL EXERCISES

### *Retreat in Everyday Life*

Week of Prayer #8 "My Own History of Sin and Grace" (p. 97- 101)

One goal of this retreat in everyday life is an increase of freedom: interior freedom, freedom to love and to respond to life. This kind of freedom comes from our deepening relationship with God. What has hindered freedom throughout our lives is being caught in self-defeating patterns, being hooked by addictive behavior, being mis-guided by the dark voices that distract us away from love. This is the disorder, the disharmony we call "sin." The risk in prayer this week is to ask with all your heart for the light of the Spirit to reveal this deep, hidden and hindering pattern. What are the inclinations that habitually and instinctively work against God's desires in me?

## HEKIMA SCHOOL FOR GIRLS COLLECTION

Jane and Bob Friel invite you to join our 16th annual monetary collection for Hekima Girls School in Bukoba, Tanzania, East Africa. This 1-6 Form school is based on the English school system. Monies donated are used where the needs are greatest: tuition assistance, room and board, fees and help with necessary projects on the school grounds.

The school of approximately 500 girls is the only rural all-girls secondary school in a region of four million people! It is staffed by local African Sisters and a few lay teachers. Our son, Bobby, served this school as a 2 year Jesuit International Volunteer in 2001 - 2002. As we have written in past years, 100% of any donation will be used by the girls to help with their educational expenses.
