

## CHRISTIAN/MUSLIM DIALOGUE

*Is Allah the Father of Jesus? What We Have Learned from 50 Years of Dialogue with Muslims*

On Wednesday, October 10, 2018 at 7:30 PM, Dr. Sandra Toenies Keating, associate professor of theology at Providence College in Rhode Island, will explore the Church's teachings on Islam and the theological implications of recent developments in Catholic-Muslim relations. When they reached the top of the stairs, she grabbed both of them and gave them a very generous hug, welcoming them into their small, upstairs apartment. Never before had they felt so welcomed into a home! Their visit was filled with the little child reading a book at their feet as they listened attentively to her mother's needs.

A recent college graduate, the young mother was just starting her new job, but it would be three weeks before the first paycheck. Her rent was due and the landlord was threatening eviction. The young woman was terrified at the possibility of losing her place and had no one to whom to turn. The Vincentians promised her help with the rent and gave her furniture and clothing vouchers. In return, she and her wonderful little girl gave them riches far above what they could offer her, treasures not made of gold.
