DRAWDOWN: SOLUTIONS TO GLOBAL WARMING

SAINT VINCENT DE PAUL

On the porch of the house she rented, the Vincentians were greeted by an alert and lively eighty-year-old neighbor with a warm smile. Inside she shared with them the story of her life. She was a deeply Christian woman, whose grandfather, when she was three, began teaching her that God is with you every minute of every day. Over the years she has had her share of troubles. She told them that she had found God's hand helping her in every difficult situation and that she blamed no one for the troubles she had encountered over the years. She was truly and confidently at peace with God and the world around her.

Her current difficulty was an electric bill that was eating up her income. The house she rented was very poorly insulated and too big for her so she was paying far too much for utilities. She had found a new smaller, energy-efficient seniors-only apartment and wanted to move there but needed financial assistance. The Vincentians were able to give her just the help she needed and she was overjoyed.

Before they left, she offered a thoughtful, beautiful prayer in her composed and confident Christian manner. One of them said, "It is easy to see Jesus in you." She started crying, saying that was the most beautiful compliment anyone had ever paid her. While they had made a difference for her, her example had been a great gift to them.
