Bring a cushion and mat or blanket to fold if you would like to sit on the floor. Otherwise, there will be chairs for sitting. There is no sign-up. The practice is free. All are welcome.

# ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

The two Vincentians visited a single, pregnant mom with two small children to respond to her request for beds, furniture, food and tokens in an apartment much in need of care. After hearing this mother's story and her frustration with receiving no help from the father, they realized that, like so many others, she needed more than just what she had asked to receive.

These are some of the needs an ordinary visit can't provide: a truck to go to SVDP to bring home the beds and furniture; a ride to the free store to receive the monthly allotment of food allocated to a family of 3; transportation to doctors, to WIC, to Kroger to redeem food stamps. (A bus ride with two children costs \$10.50 and bringing home the food on a bus is almost impossible.)

This is a call to be a part-time member of the SVDP ministry: a truck and muscle to do the deliveries, women who might be available to transport our neighbors to the Free Store/Food Bank, doctor's appointments, job interviews, etc. Because we usually visit in pairs, you might sign up with a friend. If you feel called to be of assistance in this way, please call Marie Hill at 378 – 8538. As Paul said in his letter today, "there are different forms of service but the same Lord." Perhaps one of these is a service to which the Spirit is inviting you.
